EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES POLICY

We offer a wide range of classes in Musical Theatre, Music, Speech, Drama and Dance. The purpose of the Festival is to encourage performance in such a way which cultivates a love for performing arts.

There are no restrictions but to facilitate this in a competitive environment, it is often necessary for sections to present performers in age grouped classes. The Committee is prepared to consider the introduction of classes that would further diversify the type of performance subject to their artistic merit.

GENERAL RULES

It is stressed that teachers MUST bring these rules to the notice of all performers

- 1. Any performers who are attending, or have attended, Vocational Training Colleges are ineligible to enter. For performers aged 18 and under (or 25 and under in the Vocal section and open classes in Speech and Drama), age will be reckoned as of 31st August 2023.
- 2. This year we have moved to online entry for all classes. We would very much like you to use the relevant online entry form on the website for your section. It is easy and calculates the prices for you and we will email you a detailed acknowledgement. But if that is not possible you can still print, fill in and send the paper entry form as in the past. Paper entry forms can be found on the website. Details of the dates and times of your performances will follow at a later date and therefore we will not use tickets this year. Performers will be admitted free of charge.
- 3. Entrants will perform in the order determined by the Committee and shown in the programme. Performers who fail to respond may forfeit a hearing, unless the Secretary has been informed prior to the start of the class.
- 4. Should entrants be unable to perform, substitute performers are NOT allowed.
- 5. An entry isn't registered until the correct fee is received. This year payment can be made preferably by BACS or by cheque if necessary. Details will be on the acknowledgement email. Any refunds will be at the discretion of the Committee.

- 6. Performers will be marked in accordance with the recommendations of the British and International Federation of Festivals as described above. In any Music, Speech and Drama sections, performers must obtain at least 81 marks to qualify for a medal and 84 marks for a trophy. Any Dance performer must obtain 84 marks to qualify for a trophy. THE ADJUDICATOR WILL ANNOUNCE THE FIRST 3 MARKS.
- 7. The Secretary reserves the right to limit the number of entrants in all classes, to ensure that each performer may receive a fair hearing.
- 8. Adjudicators may stop any performance when their judgement has been formed. Their decision is final.
- 9. Any protest which a performer or any other person, may wish to make, must be in writing and accompanied by a £10 deposit. Should the Committee, after investigation not uphold the protest, the deposit will be forfeited.
- 10. All trophies are awarded for 11 months and MUST be returned in good condition to the relevant Entry Secretary, not later than 4 weeks before the commencement of the Festival.
- 11. The Committee reserves the right to qualify the rules or determine any other Regulation as circumstances require.
- 12. Entrants must perform only ONCE in a solo class and must not perform the same work in more than one class. In other sections, performers may enter more than once in a duet, trio or group but with different partners and work.
- 13. In each section a Set Piece cannot also be an Own Choice piece.

- 14. In all Own Choice classes, previous winners may not compete again with the same material.
- 15. In all Own Choice classes, copies of the manuscripts/poem/prose must be provided for the Adjudicator, together with the source and publisher, or a mark will not be given.
- 16. The Committee CANNOT permit the PHOTOGRAPHING or RECORDING (audio or video) of any performance.
- 17. Recorded accompaniment is only permitted generally in Dance In other sections recorded accompaniment is only permitted if it is defined in the description of a specific class and subject to copyright consideration.
- 18. All performances using music from shows in current production are subject to copyright law and may only be performed as a concert item (i.e. with no props, costume or movement), without the need for copyright permission. Where movement or costume are included in a performance, copyright permission is required. The Festival accepts these entries on the basis that the appropriate copyright permission has been sought. Performers or teachers with queries on how to obtain permission for performance items should contact Festivals House on 01625 428297 before making entries.
- 19. All music, characterisation and dances should be age appropriate and will be marked accordingly.
- 20. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entries without assigning a reason.

LONGWELL GREEN & KINGSWOOD PERFORMING ARTS FESTIVAL CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

The British and International Federation of Festivals for Music, Dance and Speech work for amateur festivals everywhere to help create thousands of educational performance opportunities for children and young people each year.

The Federation, and our member Festivals, are committed to ensuring safe environments for children and young people and believe that it is always unacceptable for a child or young person to experience abuse of any kind. We recognise our responsibility to safeguard the welfare of all children and young people, by a commitment to recommend best practice which protects them.

This policy applies to our Board of Trustees, paid staff, Adjudicator members, volunteers, students or anyone working on behalf of the Federation and our member Festivals.

We recognise that:

- the welfare of the child/young person is paramount
- all children, regardless of age, disability, gender, racial heritage, religious belief, sexual orientation or identity, have the right to equal protection from all types of harm or abuse
- working in partnership with children, young people, their parents, carers and other agencies is essential in promoting young people's welfare.

The purpose of the policy:

- to provide protection for the children and young people who participate in our festivals, including the children of festival members
- to provide staff and volunteers with guidance on procedures they should adopt in the event that they suspect a child or young person may be experiencing, or be at risk of, harm.

We will seek to safeguard children and young people by:

- valuing them, listening to and respecting them
- adopting child protection guidelines through procedures and safe working practice for staff and volunteers
- recruiting staff and volunteers safely, ensuring all necessary checks are made
- sharing information about child protection and safe working practice with children, parents, staff and volunteers
- sharing information about concerns with agencies who need to know, and involving parents and children appropriately
- providing effective management for staff and volunteers through supervision, support and training.

The Federation will review this policy each year in November in line with Safe Network guidance or member Festivals in time for the start of the new Festival year.

CREATING SAFER FESTIVALS FOR EVERYONE

The Federation and its member Festivals use the following policies and procedures to create **Safer Festivals** for everyone:

- 1. A single, definitive Child Protection Policy adopted by all Federation Festivals.
- One or more designated Festival Safeguarding Officers (FSO) appointed for each Federation Festival. At Longwell Green & Kingswood Performing Arts Festival Kathy Goodspeed is our Safeguarding Officer - details on information page.
- 3. Best practice advice in the form of **Safe Working Practice** and **Festival Child Protection leaflets**, with support and training for all Festival staff and volunteers.

 Including clear reporting procedures for anyone with a

- concern about a child.
- 4. Appropriate recruitment and induction procedures for all new Festival staff and volunteers responsible for providing safe environments for everyone attending and/or performing at a Federation Festival.
- 5. All Festival personnel wear an official badge. All teachers, parents, guardians and carers are asked to report all incidents of any nature to anyone wearing a badge. All reported incidents will be handled in accordance with the **Safe Working Practice** and **Festival Child Protection** best practice advice. In addition we will ensure the availability of a quiet area or room where concerns can be expressed in private.
- 6. For the duration of a festival all teachers, parents, guardians, and carers are responsible for the continuous care and supervision of their own children/pupils. If they are unable to attend personally, they must delegate their responsibilities to an identified adult and ensure that their children/pupils are aware of the identity and name of the person responsible for their care. This includes supervision throughout all Festival venues, practice and changing areas that may be provided. The Festival cannot take responsibility for any property left unattended.
- 7. No unauthorised photography, audio or video recording of children and young people is allowed at our Festivals. Where parents/guardians/carers do not wish photos to be taken at all, then the responsible adult attending should ensure that their child is not included in official photos.
- 8. Some children and vulnerable adults may have specific needs in order to take part. If this is the case we ask the responsible teachers, parents, guardians or carers to contact the Festival Secretary prior to arrival. The Festival actively seeks wherever possible to meet these needs, but must know beforehand in order to prepare support or to advise that help cannot be provided on this occasion.

9. The Festival's Child Protection Policy and approach to Creating Safer Festivals for Everyone is published explicitly in our Syllabus and Programme. By completing and signing the entry form all parents, guardians, carers and teachers of entrants under 18 (or vulnerable adults of any age) confirm that they give (or have obtained) the necessary consents for the entrants to take part in the Festival. Without this consent entries to the Festival cannot be accepted.

PRIVACY NOTICE

The Longwell Green & Kingswood Performing Arts Festival is a performing arts organisation run entirely by volunteers and registered with the Charity Commission (No 1043870). It is a member of the British & International Federation of Festivals.

This privacy policy explains how we use any personal information we collect about you:

What information do we collect about you?

We collect information about you when you register to compete in the Festival, apply to become a member of the Festival/Friend of the Festival or volunteer as a steward and also if you voluntarily complete surveys or give feedback. We will only ask for such information as is necessary for the efficient administration of the festival. We do not collect 'sensitive personal data' unless there is a legitimate reason for this – where an entrant may need support to participate in a class.

How will we use the information about you?

We collect information about you in order to process your entry to classes in the Festival and for any other administrative functions of the Festival.

Access to this data will be restricted to those personnel who administer the Festival.

Access to your data and correction

You have the right to request a copy of the information that we hold about you. This can be obtained, free of charge, by application to Kathy Goodspeed (General Secretary) ((kathygoodspeed@hotmail.co.uk We want to make sure that your personal information is accurate and up to date and all reasonable efforts will be made to ensure this is the case. You may ask us to correct or remove information you think is inaccurate.

Do we share this information with anyone else?

The Festival will not pass collected data to any third party unless required to do so by law, but it should be noted that names (only) of competitors will appear in the Festival programme.

MUSIC – TIM PARKER

Tim Parker studied at the University of Sheffield, where he was awarded BMus (Hon) and MMus degrees (being twice awarded the prestigious Julian Payne Academic Prize). He is also a qualified teacher and was awarded the Cert GSMD (A) by the Guildhall School of Music and Drama. Tim works as a specialist singing teacher and choral director and has directed three award-winning choirs, including Cantelina & B&NES Music Service's Senior County Choir. He has worked as vocal consultant for several local choirs and regularly works at Regional Educational Conferences as workshop leader, specializing in choir training, sign singing and 'singing for children with special needs'. Tim was recently awarded funding to create a specialist singing resource for helping children facing challenges with their literacy and is working with Trinity College, London, to develop resources for their most recent singing syllabus.

Whilst at university Tim was a Choral Scholar and Cathedral Lay Clerk and most recently held the position of Senior Lay Clerk at Bristol Cathedral for seven years. He has toured worldwide with his own County Choir and various other professional choirs, has appeared as a soloist of several CD recordings and has broadcast on Radio3, Radio4 and BBC1. He also works as choir consultant and specialist choral adjudicator.

The emphasis is on a complete performance and presentation, rather than solely a study of music and will show ability in acting, singing, dancing and choreographic skills. Performances must show implicit dramatic content with portrayal of characters and their motivations. This is an opportunity to explore style, form and character through communicating the dramatic context of a musical text. Extracts from plays may be edited to create dialogue moving into musical scenes. [See copyright rules].

All performance must be from memory and clearly introduced.

Please note some classes may take place in the evening

We reserve the right to cancel classes, restrict the number of entries into classes or limit audience numbers should it be necessary. Please check the website for regular updates.

Please provide a copy of the script and music for the Adjudicator and a further copy of the script for the CD operator.
